End of Public Health Community Clinics

After six weeks of mass immunization clinics, **Saturday, December 12th** will be the last of our public health community clinics. Attendance at all of our clinics has been good and, to date, the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit has immunized over 55,000 persons with H1N1 vaccine and over 4,300 with seasonal influenza vaccine. The health unit has also distributed over 104,000 doses of H1N1 vaccine and over 90,000 doses of seasonal vaccine to health care providers.

Ordering H1N1 and Seasonal Influenza Vaccine

Vaccine is still available for you to offer to your patients. We have good supply of adjuvanted vaccine (Arepanrix), GSK unadjuvanted vaccine, unadjuvanted vaccine for pregnant women (Panvax) and seasonal influenza vaccines (Vaxigrip and Fluviral). Please order as you would any vaccine.

Health Unit Clinics
