

Food Recall Warning – no name and Compliments brands frozen uncooked breaded chicken products due to *Salmonella*

Attention: Long-Term Care Homes, Rest and Retirement Homes, Hospitals, Child Care Facilities, Recreational Camps, Day Camps

This fax is to advise you that the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) has issued a food recall warning for uncooked breaded chicken products due to the possibility of it containing *Salmonella*.

These chicken products including chicken burgers, strips and nuggets have been produced by Sofina Foods Inc. They have been sold under the brand names of “Compliments” and “no name”. It is our understanding that these products may have been distributed in Ontario and possibly nationally. A copy of this information should be directed to your dietary departments/culinary staff to ensure that the facility food supply has been checked, and any affected product is identified and removed from service.

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit is asking you to inform anyone who may have consumed the product to monitor themselves for signs and symptoms of salmonellosis and seek medical attention if any symptoms are experienced.

Most people with salmonellosis develop the following symptoms 6 to 72 hours after being infected: fever, chills, headache, vomiting, nausea, abdominal cramps and diarrhea. Young children, pregnant women, the elderly and people with weakened immune systems are most at risk for developing serious complications.
