High School Immunization Catch-Up Clinics for Routine Immunizations

During the pandemic, many high school students were unable to receive their routine and required immunizations. To help students get caught up, the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit (SMDHU) in partnership with local school boards, will offer school-based clinics in all high schools, throughout Simcoe Muskoka in the new year.

In January, letters will be mailed to high school students and their families to notify them if the student's record on file at the health unit is not up to date, and if not, what information is missing.

School immunization nurses will be visiting local high schools in February and March 2023 to offer catch-up clinics.

Immunizations offered will include:


- Required vaccines (Tdap booster) for 14 to 16-year-olds, Men-C-ACYW (Meningitis offered in Grade 7) and/or Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR), if missed;
- Second dose Varicella (Chicken pox vaccine), if missed (recommended but not required under the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA);
- Hepatitis B and Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines that are offered for Grade 7 students that may have been missed previously (recommended but not required under ISPA).

SMDHU recommends getting immunized according to the Publicly Funded Immunization Schedule for Ontario. Having up to date immunizations help ensure our youth have the best protection against certain preventable diseases and help reduce the risk of outbreaks in school.

The health unit is required to have up to date immunization records for all students under the Immunization of School Pupils Act for the following designated diseases:

- Diphtheria
- Tetanus
- Polio
- Measles
- Mumps
- Rubella
- Meningococcal Disease
- Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Varicella (chickenpox) for children born in 2010 or later

Students who cannot or chose not to be vaccinated are required to submit required documentation.

If students have received immunizations that have not been reported to the health unit, parents need to update their child's immunization record on file at the health unit.
