29 Sperling COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic Closing December 20th, 2023

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit (SMDHU) is closing the COVID-19 vaccine clinic at 29 Sperling Drive in Barrie, with the last day of operation on Wednesday December 20th, 2023.

This location has been the longest standing community COVID-19 vaccine clinic, operated by SMDHU and Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre (RVH) since December 2020. The clinic will continue to operate on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays until December 20th from 9am – 4pm. People who have not yet received their fall dose of COVID-19 vaccine are welcome to walk into the clinic without an appointment.

SMDHU Plans for COVID-19 Vaccination into 2024

Specific COVID-19 vaccination funding support for public heath units is ending in the new year. The health unit will have very limited capacity to support COVID-19 vaccination into 2024. At this time, the following supports for COVID-19 vaccination will continue until March 31, 2024:

- Outreach clinics in the community for priority populations
- Support for long-term care and retirement homes
- Homebound vaccination
- Continued COVID-19 vaccine distribution to facilities and health care providers providing COVID-19 vaccine
- Novavax XBB vaccine clinics once a month in Barrie

The general public will need to access their COVID-19 vaccine going forward primarily through pharmacies or potentially with some primary care providers who are providing COVID-19 vaccinations.



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Novavax XBB COVID-19 Vaccine Approved by Health Canada

On December 5, 2023, Health Canada authorized the XBB formulation of Novavax vaccine. The health unit continues to offer one clinic a month in Barrie by appointment only for people who cannot, or will not receive the recommended mRNA COVID-19 vaccines. COVID-19 Vaccine Ordering Information for Health Care Providers and Facilities

COVID-19 vaccine has become easier to store and handle over time, and the product formats are smaller for some products making use of the vaccine less prohibitive for vaccine delivery agents. If your practice or facility would like to order COVID-19 vaccine to have available for clients, please use the following COVID-19 vaccine order form. Here is a summary table of the current mRNA vaccines available to health care providers:

A reminder to all HCPs that all doses of COVID-19 vaccine in Ontario must be documented in the COVAXon system. If you have new staff in your facility that require set up or accounts that need to be reset, please email covaxsupport@smdhu.org

We ask that when documenting in COVAXon, all users ensure that the client's information is up to date.

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This is especially important for residents in long-term care homes and retirement homes. Please be sure to update the reason for immunization to LTCH Rhome resident, and the institution to the current location that the client is living.
