#### **Current Situation**

## Highlights:

- Since the Partner Update on July 2<sup>nd</sup>, there have been 4 new cases of COVID-19, 32 recoveries, no deaths and one less hospitalization in Simcoe Muskoka.
- Today there were no new cases, hospitalizations or deaths reported.

#### Case Characteristics and Status

- The median age of those who have recovered is 47 years compared to the median age of 83 years among those who have died.
- The rate of COVID-19 infections is higher among those that live in areas with moderate and high ethnic diversity when compared to areas with lower ethnic diversity as measured by the Ontario Marginalization Index.

## Testing

- Testing rates were lower in the last week with 90.5 new COVID-19 tests per 10,000 population in Simcoe County and 78 tests per 10,000 population in Muskoka. This is in comparison with the provincial average of 116 tests per 10,000 population.
- The percent positivity rate in Simcoe County is 0.3% and 0% in Muskoka District compared to the provincial percent positivity rate of 0.7%. A low percent positivity rate indicates the outbreak is under control, given more testing is finding a smaller and smaller proportion of positives.

#### Local Outbreaks

- There is currently one ongoing workplace outbreak.
- Approximately one-fifth (18%) of COVID-19 cases in Simcoe Muskoka have been associated with a local institutional outbreak.

## **Highlights:**

- Today there are an additional 118 new cases (a 0.3% increase from yesterday) and 9 new deaths (a 0.3% increase from yesterday).
- There are currently 35 people in ICU with 26 on ventilators.
- A total of 4,452 people have been hospitalized (12.3%) with 965 needing intensive care (2.7%).
- A total of 1,582,361 tests have been completed, with 22,832 tests completed in the previous day.

- There were 267 new cases of COVID-19 in the past 24 hours.
- New cases were reported in six of 13 provinces/territories within the past 24 hours.
- Deaths were reported in four of 13 provinces/territories within the past 24 hours.
- The majority of cases (87%) and deaths (95%) have been reported by Ontario and Quebec.
- Over three million people have been tested representing a test rate of 81,282 per 1 million people.
- Since May 1<sup>st</sup>, a decreasing rate of cases has been observed among all age groups, particularly among those over 80 years of age.
- The highest incidence rate per age and sex is among younger age groups.
- Ontario has the highest age-standardized incidence rate in Canada with 8.1 cases per 100,000 population.

The <u>weekly epidemiology report</u> is now updated Thursdays, with higher-level <u>daily</u> epidemiology updates posted at 20:00 EDT on the Government of Canada website.

- There have been over 1.1 million additional cases and over 25,000 deaths worldwide in the last week.
- July 4<sup>th</sup> marked the highest number of cases in a single day worldwide with 211,411 cases.
- In the last week, the U.S.A., Brazil, India, South Africa and Russia had the highest number of cases and Brazil, Mexico, U.S.A, India and Peru had the highest number of deaths.

## SMDHU Medical Officer of Health Key Messages from Tuesday July 7, 2020

## **Use of Face Coverings/Non-Medical Masks**

- As we move through the stages of reopening of the economy there is an increased risk of resurgence of COVID-19 transmission in our communities. Therefore under the authority of the provincial Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act (EMCPA) in an effort to prevent the possible spread of COVID-19 we are instructing all businesses, organizations and transit services to have a policy requiring people entering indoor public spaces to wear a face covering/mask. The instructions go into effect July 13<sup>th</sup> 12:01 a.m. (Correspondence to Businesses and Organizations; Letter to Municipalities and CAOs)
- Rationale for issuing the instructions:
  - We need to take precautions to reduce the risk of a resurgence of COVID-19 transmission in our communities. This resurgence has already been seen internationally.
  - Emerging evidence (ecological studies & modelling) suggests that COVID-19 transmission rates can be reduced with a high level of population compliance of non-medical mask use.
  - Simcoe Muskoka is experiencing a large and increasing number of visitors from parts of the province with higher incidence of COVID-19, with resultant crowding.
  - Voluntary compliance with mask use in indoor public places appears to be suboptimal.
  - High degree of support from community partners / physicians / hospitals / some businesses / municipal CAOs and politicians for SMDHU to require mask use in indoor public places.
  - Regulation within the EMCPA allowing for health unit and municipalities to enforce, although we are relying on promotion and public good will for success.

# International Updates since the July 2<sup>nd</sup> Partner Update

The World Health Organization (WHO):

- Held a webinar on the <u>chemical impact of using disinfectants</u>, hand <u>sanitizers</u>, and personal protective equipment also outlining recommendations to ensure the safety of chemical products being used to stop the spreading of the virus.
- Regional Director for the Western Pacific, spoke of <u>a 'new normal'</u>, one that improves both health and livelihoods during a virtual press conference with the World Economic Forum on COVID-19. He added "This 'new future' is the dividend of COVID-19 which WHO hopes for."

- Is holding an <u>infodemic public webinar</u> July 21, to present findings of global discussions and interventions. The <u>program</u>, <u>graphic summaries</u> of talks and some of the global infodemic talks are also available online.
- PAHO (Pan American Health Organization) Director, said countries planning to relax public health measures <u>must take a phased approach based on local conditions and be prepared to impose preventive measures again if the epidemiological situation changes.</u>
