COVID-19 Return to School or Child Care: Protocol for Employees/Visitors

While an employee or visitor of a school and/or child care is waiting for COVID-19 test results, they must remain in self-isolation and cannot attend school/child care in-person.

Negative COVID-19 Test Result



If staff/visitor gets tested for COVID-19 and receives a negative result, they can return to school if all of the following apply:

- They do not have a fever (without using medication), AND
- It has been at least 24 hours since their symptoms started improving, AND
- They were not in close physical contact with someone who currently has COVID-19.

Follow School Board direction for return to school documentation requirements.

Note: If a staff/visitor has had known close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or the staff/visitor has travelled out of country, they will need to remain in isolation until 14 days have passed since their last exposure even if they have a negative test result.

Not Tested for COVID-19



Staff/visitor must remain home for a minimum of 10 days from the onset of symptoms AND have symptoms improving for at least 24 hours and be free of fever (without using medication), before returning to school.

OR

Has received an alternate diagnosis by a health care provider (i.e. symptoms are not due to COVID-19) **AND** symptoms have been improving for at least 24 hours.

Follow School Board direction for return to school documentation requirements.

Positive COVID-19 Test Result



Staff/visitor who test positive for COVID-19 will remain in isolation until follow up with public health has been completed and these three conditions have been met:

- 1) They have isolated for a minimum of 10 days after the onset of symptoms, **AND**
- 2) They no longer have a fever (without using medication), **AND**
- 3) Their symptoms have been improving for at least 24 hours.

Note:

Everyone in your household **MUST** stay home if you or anyone else has COVID-19 symptoms until one of the following occurs:

- 1. The person with symptoms is tested for COVID-19 and test results are negative; OR
- 2. An alternate diagnosis is given by a healthcare provider for the person who has symptoms.

If the person with symptoms in the household does NOT get tested, everyone else in the household MUST stay home for:

- 14 days from the last contact with the person with symptoms if the ill person can self-isolate away from the rest of the household; or
- 24 days from start of the sick person's symptom(s) if the ill person CANNOT self-isolate away from the rest of the household.
