Key messages from Dr. Gardner, Medical Officer of Health

In the last day:

- 75 people tested positive, 205 people recovered, and there were 4 new deaths.
- There were 59 new variant cases* identified.

Currently:

- There have been 186 new cases reported to the health unit for the current week.
- 38 Simcoe Muskoka residents are hospitalized with COVID-19.
- There are 1,040 active variant cases*.
- There are 17 ongoing outbreaks (workplaces: 9, congregate settings: 3, institutions: 3, community settings: 1, educational settings: 1), including 11 active outbreaks with known variant cases.

Since the last Partner Update:

- We have reported 532 new cases, 444 recoveries, and 7 new deaths.
- There are 47 more active cases compared to the same day last week.
- There are 3 fewer active outbreaks compared to the same day last week.
- During the week of April 25, there were 548 new cases reported to the health unit, which was 14% lower than the 638 cases reported the week prior.

Highlights:

- 26,752 immunizations have been provided since the last Partner Update.
- Over 206,200 people have received their first dose, representing 33.1% of the population in Simcoe Muskoka. This includes:
 - 25,891 adults 80 years of age and older (87%);
 - o 45,035 adults 70-79 years of age (82%);
 - o 25,636 adults 65-69 years of age (66%).
- Over 32,800 doses of the AstraZeneca vaccine have been administered by primary care settings and pharmacies in Simcoe Muskoka.
- Nearly 20,600 people have received both required doses of the vaccine, representing 3.3% of the population in Simcoe Muskoka.

As of today:

- There were 2,941 new cases, 4,361 resolved cases, and 44 deaths in the last day.
- There is a total of 80,511 confirmed cases of the U.K. variant, 317 cases of the South African variant, and 1,001 cases of the Brazilian variant.
- A total of 2,075 people are hospitalized for COVID-19, 882 people are in intensive care units (ICU) and 620 people are on ventilators.
- There are 728 ongoing outbreaks (workplaces: 255, schools and childcares: 161, health care settings: 108, other settings: 105, congregate living: 99).

Since the last Partner Update:

- There have been 24,027 new cases, 27,705 recoveries, and 199 deaths.
- There are 3,877 fewer active cases compared to the same day last week.
- There are 206 fewer people hospitalized, 5 more people in the ICU, and 15 more people on ventilators compared to the same day last week.
- The 7-day average number of new daily cases is 3,432.

Vaccine status:

• A total of 5,599,723 vaccine doses have been administered to date, with 132,603 doses administered yesterday. 381,123 people in Ontario have been fully vaccinated.

Regional updates:

- Areas with the highest number of active cases per 100,000 population: Peel (580.28),
 Toronto (433.96), Niagara (281.54), Durham (266.62), and York (252.63).
- Areas with the highest number of active cases: Toronto (11,854), Peel (8,018), York (2,804), Ottawa (1,867), and Durham (1,722).

Weekly Epidemiological Summary highlights: April 18-24, 2021:

- During the week of April 18, there were 27,736 cases reported, representing a 10.2% decrease compared to the week prior. Cases decreased across all age groups.
- While most health unit regions saw a decrease in cases compared to the previous week, the North West region saw a 48.9% increase in cases.

Yesterday:

- Canada reported 6,689 new cases and 56 deaths.
- New cases were reported in all provinces and territories except YT.
- New deaths were reported in BC, AB, SK, MB, ON, QC, and NS.

Since the last Partner Update:

- In the last week, 54,961 people tested positive for COVID-19, 331 people died, and 56,243 people recovered.
- There are 1,613 fewer active cases of COVID-19 than there was a week ago.

Between April 19 and April 26, 2021:

- The number of COVID-19 patients hospitalized decreased from 3,205 to 3,182.
- The number of COVID-19 patients in ICU beds increased from 1,215 to 1,365.
- The number of COVID-19 patients mechanically vented increased from 747 to 788.

Weekly epidemiology update: April 18-24, 2021:

- New cases decreased by 5% compared to the previous week, with an average of 8,279 new cases reported every day.
- New deaths increased by 17% compared to the previous week, with an average of 49 deaths reported every day.
- The number of weekly hospitalizations and ICU admissions continued to increase, with an 18% increase in hospitalized cases and a 19% increase in ICU admissions compared to the week prior.
- Daily case rates remain highest among those 20-39 years of age and lowest among those 80 years and older.
- According to forecasting, between 1,260,540 to 1,305,380 cumulative reported cases and 24,450 to 25,200 deaths are expected by May 9, 2021.

Key vaccine updates as of April 24, 2021:

- 29.31% of the population has received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, including: 88.06% of adults aged 80 or older and 84.34% of adults 70-79 years of age.
- 2.55% of population have received both required doses of the vaccine.

In the last day:

- There were 632,531 new cases and 10,713 deaths.
- India, Turkey, Brazil, Iran, and Argentina reported the most new cases and India, Brazil, Argentina, Colombia, and Turkey reported the most deaths.

In the past week:

- Over 5.6 million new cases and 92,376 deaths were reported.
- India, Brazil, the U.S., Turkey, and France reported the most new cases and India, Brazil, the U.S., Colombia, and Argentina reported the most new deaths.

Highlights from Weekly Epidemiological Summary as of May 2, 2021:

- For the second consecutive week, the number of global cases remains at the highest level since the beginning of the pandemic, with over 5.7 million weekly cases reported.
- The number of reported new deaths increased for the seventh consecutive week, with over 93,000 deaths reported.
- India accounted for 46% of global cases and 25% of global deaths reported this week.
