In the last day:

• 25 people tested positive, 2 people recovered, there was 1 new hospitalization, and there were no new deaths.

Currently:

- There have been 51 new cases reported to the health unit for the current week.
- 25 Simcoe Muskoka residents are hospitalized with COVID-19.
- There are 137 active variant cases\*.
- There are 9 ongoing outbreaks (workplaces: 5, congregate settings: 2, institutions: 1, educational settings: 1), including 6 active outbreaks with known variant cases.

# Since the last Partner Update:

- We have reported 148 new cases, 209 recoveries, and no new deaths.
- There are 66 fewer active cases compared to the same day last week.
- There is one less active outbreak compared to the same day last week.
- During the week of May 30, there were 152 cases reported to the health unit, which was 27% lower than the 207 cases reported the week prior.

# Highlights:

- 42,814 immunizations have been provided since the last Partner Update.
- Nearly 357,800 people have received their first dose, representing 59% of the total population and 70% of adults ages 18 and older in Simcoe Muskoka. This includes:
  - 211,285 adults 50 years of age and older (83%);
  - o 132,471 adults 18-49 years of age (55%); and,
  - 14,022 youth 12-17 years of age (36%).
- Nearly 50,400 people have received both required doses of the vaccine, representing 8.3% of the total population and 10.2% of adults 18 and older in Simcoe Muskoka.

# As of today:

- There were 411 new cases, 932 resolved cases, and 33 deaths in the last day.
- There has been a total of 134,608 confirmed cases of the U.K. variant, 1,125 cases of the South African variant, and 4,073 cases of the Brazilian variant.
- A total of 571 people are hospitalized for COVID-19, 466 people are in intensive care units (ICU), and 314 people are on ventilators.
- There are 237 ongoing COVID-19 outbreaks (workplaces: 93, other settings: 45, congregate living: 36, schools and childcares: 35, health care settings: 28).

# Since the last Partner Update:

- There have been 4,596 new cases, 8,307 recoveries, and 129 deaths.
- There are 3,840 fewer active cases compared to the same day last week.
- There are 137 fewer people hospitalized, 110 fewer people in the ICU, and 85 fewer people on ventilators compared to the same day last week.
- The 7-day average number of new daily cases is 657.

Vaccine status:

- A total of 10,445,119 vaccine doses have been administered to date, with 177,506 doses administered yesterday.
- 62.2% of all Ontarians and 70.8% of those ages 12 and older have received their first vaccine dose. 8.7% of all Ontarians and 9.9% of those ages 12 and older have been fully vaccinated with two doses.

Regional updates:

- Areas with the highest number of active cases per 100,000 population: Porcupine (412.11), Peel (97.49), Toronto (68.97), Brant (66.69), and Hamilton (61.65).
- Areas with the highest number of active cases: Toronto (1,884), Peel (1,347), Ottawa (447), York (350), and Porcupine (347).

# Weekly Epidemiological Summary highlights: May 23-29, 2021:

- During the week of May 16, there were 7,766 new cases reported, which represented a 38.6% decrease compared to the 12,645 cases reported the week prior. This is the largest single-week decrease in weekly cases observed since widespread transmission was established in Ontario.
- 69.2% of reported cases this week tested positive for a mutation or variant of concern.

Yesterday:

- Canada reported 1,268 new cases and 30 new deaths.
- New cases were reported in all provinces and territories except PEI, NWT, and NT.
- New deaths were reported in AB, SK, MB, ON, QC, and NL.

Since the last Partner Update:

- In the last week, 12,196 people tested positive for COVID-19, 225 people died, and 21,596 people recovered.
- There are 9,625 fewer active cases of COVID-19 than there was a week ago.

Between May 24 and May 31, 2021:

- The number of COVID-19 patients hospitalized decreased from 2,017 to 1,501.
- The number of COVID-19 patients in ICU beds decreased from 1,073 to 894.
- The number of COVID-19 patients mechanically vented decreased from 619 to 507.

Weekly epidemiology update: May 23-29, 2021:

- New cases decreased by 35% compared to the previous week, with an average of 2,981 new cases reported every day.
- New deaths decreased by 7% compared to the previous week, with an average of 39 deaths reported every day.
- The number of weekly hospitalizations decreased by 15% and the number of weekly cases in the ICU decreased by 11% compared to the week prior.
- Variants of concern represented approximately 65% of reported cases from mid-April to early May 2021.
- According to forecasting, between 1,391,670 to 1,412,280 cumulative reported cases and 25,790 to 26,350 cumulated reported deaths are expected by June 13, 2021.

Key vaccine updates as of May 29, 2021:

- 56.78% of the population has received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, including 68.33% of adults ages 18 and older.
- 5.71% of the population has been fully vaccinated, including 7.02% of adults ages 18 and older.

- There were 356,061 new cases and 8,607 deaths.

- Nearly 2.9 million new cases and 71,593 deaths were reported.
- India, Brazil, Argentina, Colombia, and the U.S. reported the most new cases and India, Brazil, Mexico, Argentina, and the U.S., reported the most new deaths.

Weekly Epidemiological Summary highlights: May 31-June 6, 2021:

- During the week of May 31, there was a 15% decrease in new global cases and an 8% decrease in new global deaths reported compared to the week prior.
- Despite the continued downward trend in new cases and deaths, many countries across all six WHO regions have reported rises in the number of cases and deaths.
