In the last day:

• 8 people tested positive, 15 people recovered, there was 1 new hospitalization, and there were 2 new deaths.

Currently:

- There have been 12 new cases reported to the health unit for the current week.
- 11 Simcoe Muskoka residents are hospitalized with COVID-19.
- There are 33 active variant cases*.
- There are 3 ongoing outbreaks (congregate settings: 2, workplaces: 1), including 2 outbreaks with known variant cases.
- There has been a total of 52 confirmed cases of the Delta variant in Simcoe Muskoka.

Since the last Partner Update:

- We have reported 42 new cases, 79 recoveries, and 2 new deaths.
- There are 30 fewer active cases compared to the same day last week.
- There is 1 more active outbreak compared to the same day last week.
- During the week of June 20, there were 40 new cases reported to the health unit, which was 38% lower than the 64 cases reported the week prior.

*Variant cases encompass confirmed VOC cases and positive screens for a VOC. Caution should be taken when interpreting these data due to potential sampling biases and delay between sample collection and sequencing in recent weeks.

Highlights:

- 61,960 immunizations have been provided since the last Partner Update.
- Over 392,700 people have received their first dose, representing 65% of the total population and 74% of those ages 12 and older in Simcoe Muskoka. This includes:
 - 217,722 adults 50 years of age and older (86%);
 - o 152,482 adults 18-49 years of age (64%); and,
 - 22,533 youth 12-17 years of age (58%).
- Over 167,800 people have received both required doses of the vaccine, representing 27.8% of the total population and 31.6% of those 12 and older in Simcoe Muskoka.

As of today:

- There were 184 new cases, 322 resolved cases, and 14 deaths in the last day.
- The total confirmed variant of concern cases in Ontario are as follows:
 - o Lineage B.1.1.7 (Alpha variant): 143,444
 - o Lineage B.1.351 (Beta variant): 1,365
 - Lineage P.1 (Gamma variant): 4,544
 - o Lineage B.1.617.2 (Delta variant): 1,909
- A total of 251 people are hospitalized with COVID-19, 271 people are in intensive care units (ICU) due to COVID-related critical illness, and 181 people are on ventilators.
- A total of 14,741,138 vaccine doses have been administered. 67.2% of all Ontarians and 76.8% of those ages 12 and older have received their first vaccine dose. 32.5% of all Ontarians and 37.2% of those ages 12 and older have been fully vaccinated.
- There are 102 ongoing COVID-19 outbreaks (workplaces: 36, other settings: 22, congregate living: 20, schools and childcares: 15, health care settings: 9).

Since the last Partner Update:

- There have been 1,878 new cases, 2,578 recoveries, and 75 deaths.
- There are 775 fewer active cases compared to the same day last week.
- The number of confirmed cases of the Delta variant has nearly doubled.
- There are 44 fewer people hospitalized, 34 fewer people in the ICU, and 9 fewer people on ventilators compared to the same day last week.

• The 7-day average number of new daily cases is 268.

Regional updates:

- Areas with the highest number of active cases per 100,000 population: Porcupine (93.82), Waterloo (70.63), North Bay (53.30), Grey Bruce (35.39), and Lambton (24.48).
- Areas with the highest number of active cases: Toronto (482), Waterloo (378), Peel (212), Grey Bruce (158), and Hamilton (112).

Weekly Epidemiological Summary highlights: June 13-19, 2021:

- During the week of June 13, there were 2,433 new cases reported, which represented a 30% decrease compared to the 3,492 cases reported the week prior.
- The only health units in Ontario with a rate of over 40 COVID-19 cases per 100,000 population were Porcupine Health Unit and Region of Waterloo. Of note, case rates in these regions decreased during the week of June 13 compared to the week prior.

Yesterday:

- Canada reported 602 new cases and 35 new deaths.
- New cases were reported in all provinces and territories except NL, NWT, and NT.
- New deaths were reported in AB, SK, ON, and QC.

Since the last Partner Update:

- In the last week, 4,530 people tested positive for COVID-19, 118 people died, and 7,127 people recovered.
- There are 2,715 fewer active cases of COVID-19 than there was a week ago.

Key vaccine updates as of June 30, 2021:

- 67.4% of the population has received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, including 77.4% of those ages 12 and older.
- 29.8% of the population has been fully vaccinated, including 34.2% of those ages 12 and older.

Between June 14 and June 21, 2021:

- The number of COVID-19 patients hospitalized decreased from 981 to 696.
- The number of COVID-19 patients in ICU beds decreased from 563 to 471.
- The number of COVID-19 patients mechanically vented decreased from 337 to 282.

Weekly epidemiology report: June 13-19, 2021:

- New cases decreased by 27% compared to the previous week, with an average of 1,016 new cases reported every day.
- New deaths decreased by 27% compared to the previous week, with an average of 20 deaths reported every day.
- The number of weekly hospitalizations decreased by 22% and the number of weekly cases in the ICU decreased by 20% compared to the week prior.
- Although cases are declining, variants of concern represented an increasing proportion (approximately 70%) of reported cases at the end of May 2021.

• According to forecasting, between 1,413,010 to 1,420,740 cumulative reported cases and 26,175 to 26,475 cumulative reported deaths are expected by July 4, 2021.

In the last day:

- There were 320,920 new cases and 6,658 deaths.
- India, Colombia, Brazil, the U.K., and Russia reported the most new cases and India, Russia, Colombia, Brazil, and Argentina reported the most new deaths.

In the past week:

- Over 2.6 million new cases and 56,936 deaths were reported.
- Brazil, India, Colombia, Argentina, and Russia reported the most new cases and the most new deaths.

Weekly Epidemiological Summary highlights: June 21-27, 2021:

- During the week of June 14, there were over 2.6 million new cases reported, which was similar to the number of cases reported the week prior.
- There were over 57,000 deaths reported, which represented a 10% decrease compared to the week prior and the lowest weekly mortality figure since early November 2020.
- Sharp upward trends were noted in the African region this week, with a 33% increase in cases and a 42% increase in deaths compared to the week prior.
