Key issues

Enforcement of proof of vaccination

- Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit (SMDHU) has taken a measured approach to
 enforcement throughout the pandemic and we continue to work with our partners to
 assist businesses and organizations in understanding their responsibilities under the
 ROA. As such, we will also continue with our proactive and reactive responses to
 complaints and issues as we receive them. SMDHU will continue to strive to reduce
 transmission of the virus in our community settings by working with businesses and
 organizations to adhere to the requirements of the ROA.
- Education, compliance and enforcement of the Reopening Ontario Act (ROA) including the addition of proof of vaccination is enforceable by municipalities (via Bylaw), police, health unit and other provincial agencies.
- Specific to proof of vaccination, SMDHU will take a graduated approach with emphasis on education and communication to ensure businesses and organizations understand their responsibilities under the legislation. We have a number of resources available on our <u>website</u>, as well as staff on our Health Connection lines to assist operators and businesses during this time.

COVID-19 precautions in schools and childcare settings

- The health unit is currently monitoring three small confirmed COVID-19 outbreaks within elementary schools in Bradford and Alliston. Transmission has only occurred within single class cohorts/classrooms and not widespread in the schools. We continue to work closely with school board partners, schools and childcare operators to minimize risk and disruption for other students/staff. Information about current COVID-19 outbreaks is updated daily on weekdays on the SMDHU website.
- If a potential exposure or outbreak is identified at a school/childcare, SMDHU will contact parents/students by letter. Those receiving letters with requirements to isolate must do so under the <u>Class Order for Self-Isolation</u> issued by SMDHU's medical officer of health and failure to follow this order may result in fines.
- The public is reminded to continue to practice public health measures outside of school/childcare hours to minimize transmission and that anyone who develops symptoms of COVID-19 must isolate immediately and seek testing at an assessment centre.

Revised Section 22 Order for Self-Isolation

- On Sept. 21, SMDHU revised its <u>Class Order for Self-Isolation</u>. The revisions update the Section 22 Order from May 27, clarifying the expectations regarding COVID-19 testing and outcomes, and explaining the rationale behind them.
- The Class Order for Self-Isolation applies to any person living or present in the County of Simcoe and District of Muskoka who:
 - Has symptoms of COVID-19, regardless of whether they are fully vaccinated and/or if they get tested.
 - Tests positive for COVID-19.
 - Was a recent close contact with someone who has symptoms of COVID-19 or who tested positive for COVID-19. This includes caregivers and household members.
 - Is a household member of a person in recent close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19.

Routine immunization clinics to resume in Simcoe Muskoka

- Starting the week of Sept. 27, SMDHU's Immunization Program will begin the phased reopening of public immunization clinics that were on hold since March 2020, due to the demands of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Immunization clinics will be run at most SMDHU branch offices and at 15 Sperling Dr. in Barrie. Appointments will first be available to individuals 0-6 years of age who are overdue for their routine immunizations, with appointments for adolescent boosters and adult vaccinations becoming available in the following weeks.
- Public immunization clinics are by appointment only and can be booked through the health unit's online booking system at <u>www.smdhu.org</u> or by calling Health Connection at 705-721-7520.
- The health unit will also resume the School Immunization Program where students are offered Hepatitis B, Meningitis C-ACYW and Human Papillomavirus vaccines at school-based clinics. This year these vaccines will be offered to all Grade 7 and 8 students, with additional catch-up clinics being offered on PA days and over the winter break for those who missed their school clinic, online learners, and students who are in Grade 9 this school year who did not receive both doses of their HPV or Hepatitis B vaccine at school in 2019/2020, due to COVID-19 school closures.
- COVID-19 vaccinations for individuals born before 2010 are available at many pharmacies, through some primary care providers, and at <u>29 Sperling Dr. in Barrie.</u>

 <u>Highlights</u> In total 870,935 doses of COVID-19 vaccine have been administered in Simcoe Muskoka, including doses administered by local pharmacies. 447,572 individuals living 				

- in Simcoe Muskoka have received at least one dose of vaccine, which represents 74% of the total population.
 Currently 84% of the population 12 years and older living in Simcoe Muskoka have had
- Currently 84% of the population 12 years and older living in Sincoe Muskoka have had at least one dose of vaccine including 82% of youth 12 to 17 years of age who have received at least one dose of vaccine.
- The rate of COVID-19 infection among the unvaccinated vaccine-eligible Simcoe Muskoka population is **12** times higher than it is for the fully vaccinated population and the rate of COVID-19 hospitalizations is **54** times higher.

School Vaccine Clinic Summary

From September 9th to September 17th there were 18 school-based COVID-19 vaccine clinics in Simcoe Muskoka:

- 2,177 total doses administered 44% were first doses
- 38% of doses went to school-aged children (almost half of these were first doses)

As of yesterday:

- There were 677 new cases, 676 resolved cases, and 7 deaths in the last day.
- Of the 677 new cases, 278 are unvaccinated, 21 are partially vaccinated and 131 are fully vaccinated and 33 are status unknown.
- A total of 307 people are hospitalized with COVID-19, 193 people are in intensive care units (ICU) due to COVID-related critical illness, and 134 people are on ventilators.
- A total of 21,283,180 vaccine doses have been administered. 74% of all Ontarians have received their first vaccine dose and 69% have been fully vaccinated.
- Of all eligible Ontarians 12 years of age and older 85% have at least one dose and 79% are fully vaccinated.
- There are currently 146 active COVID-19 outbreaks in Ontario.

Since the last Partner Update:

- There have been 4,655 new cases, 4,894 recoveries, and 45 deaths.
- There are 284 less active cases compared to the same day last week.
- There are 41 less people hospitalized, 2 more people in the ICU, and 14 less people on ventilators compared to the same day last week.
- The 7-day average number of new daily cases is 665.
