



Simcoe Muskoka Environmental Scan Report

Purpose

The purpose of this environmental scan was to review and assess community organizations and networks whose mandates and policy work are related to the six Healthy Communities Priority Areas and to identify their mission, vision, mandate, programs and/or policy/advocacy work related to the six factors within the Healthy Communities Ontario Framework. The environmental scan will contribute to the development of the **Simcoe Muskoka Community Picture** under the Healthy Communities Fund, Partnership Stream supported by the Ontario Ministry of Health Promotion and Sport. The six priority areas of interest are: healthy eating; physical activity; tobacco use/exposure; injury prevention; mental health promotion and alcohol and substance misuse.

Method for Scanning Websites:

The Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit team identified fifty-two organizations servicing Simcoe Muskoka for information to be collected via **website scans** to identify their mission, vision, mandate, programs and policy/advocacy work related to the six factors of interest. Please note: this environmental scan was a review of information on websites only, and may not be a complete summary of all the programs, services or policy work of these organizations if the information was not included in the website.



Organizations were first selected who provide service to all of Simcoe Muskoka and, in the absence of that, organizations who provide service in Simcoe or Muskoka and are mirrored by a similarly mandated organization in Muskoka or Simcoe, respectively. - Include the information found in the data collection template, including web-links to documents if available.



Results:

The fifty-two organizations were scanned for relevant information during the months of November 2010 and January 2011. The number one problem presented at ERs within NSM LHIN is injury, poisoning and certain other consequences of external causes, such as falls, which accounts for 22% of all visits.
