Updated: Provincial Testing Guidance & Reference Document for Symptoms

As of May 14, 2020, the <u>provincial testing recommendations</u> (<u>http://www.simcoemuskokahealth.org/docs/default-source/COVID-/2019 covid testing guidance-(april-15-2020).pdf?sfvrsn=6</u>) have be updated to include:

- New guidance to test any individual presenting with at least one symptom or sign from the reference document for symptoms (http://www.simcoemuskokahealth.org/docs/default-source/COVID-/200502-2019 reference doc symptoms.pdf?sfvrsn=2)
- Additional guidance to test any symptomatic individual who is a **household contact** of a healthcare worker, care provider, first responder or **emergency child care worker**
- Addition of multisystem inflammatory vasculitis to symptoms list
- Removal of hoarse voice and sneezing from symptoms list

Updated: Case Definitions

As of May 11, 2020, the <u>probable case definition</u> (http://www.health.gov.on.ca/en/pro/programs/publichealth/coronavirus/docs/2019_case_definition.pdf) was changed to:

- A person (who has not had a laboratory test) with symptoms compatible with COVID-19 AND:
 - Traveled to an affected area (including inside of Canada) in the 14 days prior to symptom onset;
 OR
 - Close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19; OR
 - Lived in or worked in a facility known to be experiencing an outbreak of COVID-19 (e.g. long-term care, correctional setting); **OR**
- A person with symptoms compatible with COVID-19 AND in whom laboratory diagnosis of COVID-19 is inconclusive*.

*Inconclusive is defined as an indeterminate on a single or multiple real-time PCR target(s) and is not detected or remains indeterminate by an alternative real-time PCR assay or without sequencing confirmation, or a positive test with an assay that has limited performance data available.

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Updated: COVID-19 Guidance: Acute Care

As of May 11, 2020, the <u>Acute Care guidance document</u> (<u>http://www.health.gov.on.ca/en/pro/programs/publichealth/coronavirus/docs/2019_acute_care_guidance.pdf</u>) has been updated to include:

- Addition of an outbreak definition:
 - Two or more laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 cases (patients and/or staff) within a specified area (unit/floor/service) within a 14-day period where both cases could have reasonably acquired their infection in the hospital
- Guidance on outbreak detection and management

Updated: Patient Screening Guidance Document

The COVID-19 <u>patient screening guidance document</u> (<u>http://www.simcoemuskokahealth.org/docs/default-source/COVID-/200502-2019_patient_screening_guidance.pdf?sfvrsn=2</u>) has been updated to include direction that any patient presenting to a healthcare setting should be screened positive if they identify:

- Any travel outside of Ontario (no longer only outside of Canada) in the past 14 days; or
- Any symptom/sign of COVID-19.
