Syphilis on the Rise - Testing and Treatment Recommendations AND Lyme Disease Update

The Simcoe Muskoka area is reporting a notable increase in all cases of syphilis over the last three years. In 2018, 2019 and 2020 there were 21, 40 and 56 cases respectively. This represents crude rates of 3.6 to 9.3 cases per 100,000 population in Simcoe Muskoka in contrast to provincial rates reported in 2019 and 2020 of 23.6 and 21.3 cases per 100,000.

Syphilis is spread by direct contact with a syphilis chancre/lesion, which occurs mainly on the external genitals, vagina, anus or in the rectum. Lesions can also occur on the lips and in the mouth. Transmission occurs during vaginal, anal or oral sex. In addition, an infected mother can pass syphilis to her baby during pregnancy or delivery. Lesions are often not recognized as they are painless, thus most transmission is caused by people who are unaware of their infection. If syphilis is not treated early, it can progress to cause complications of the nervous system, cardiovascular system or tissue destruction of any organ. Consider offering your patients a full STBBI screen, including chlamydia, gonorrhea, syphilis, and HIV tests, if they have had unprotected sex with a new partner in the last month.

Treatment recommendations for syphilis depends on the staging of the disease. Public Health Agency of Canada recommends first line treatment with Benzathine Penicillin LA-G. **Short Acting penicillin agents are not adequate to cure syphilis. Benazthine Penicillin LA-G is accessible ONLY** through local health units.
