## What is psychosocial support?

"Psychosocial support" refers to services that help an individual cope with the aftermath of an emergency. Psychosocial support is less about counselling and more about empowering a person by providing the tools necessary to deal with a situation and allowing them to adequately control their responses and decision-making.<sup>1</sup>

## Who needs psychosocial support?

After experiencing traumatic events, people may become so overwhelmed that they are unable to cope.

Psychological trauma often builds up when events keep running over and over in your mind, leaving you unable to keep your thoughts together.

Many people regularly use psychosocial support services:

- First responders (fire, police, ambulance)
- Spouses/family members of first responders
- General public after a traumatic event
- Self-identified individuals

## Where can I get psychosocial support services?

Anyone who identifies the need for psychosocial support can access them from a variety of non-government and government organizations. These agencies provide psychosocial support to individuals and communities. Please see the listings below and/or consult with your health care provider or Employee Assistance Program (if available through your employer).
