Reported Local Influenza Cases

In Simcoe Muskoka, there have been 14 lab-confirmed influenza cases reported as of 10 May 2022 - 4 cases (29%) of influenza were reported in week 18.

Of the 14 reported influenza A cases, 3 have been subtyped:

- 3/3 (100%) are influenza A, H3 strain
- 0/3 (0%) are influenza A, H1 strain/ H1N1 pdm09.

Technical Notes

Definitions

<u>Percentage positivity</u>: the number of positive flu cases divided by the number of specimens tested at Public Health Ontario Labs

Reported activity level: the level of influenza activity that is reported to Public Health Ontario by Simcoe Muskoka, based on influenza cases and outbreaks. Definitions available here (page 8)

<u>Surveillance week</u>: The week number corresponding to the week of year, running Sunday to Saturday, inclusive, for reporting influenza activity. January 1 always falls within week 1. A list of the current season's surveillance weeks can be found <u>here</u> (Appendix B)

Limitations

Timeliness:

The provincial data are from one week previous because that is the most recent data available.

The hospital data, local counts of influenza, and outbreaks are current to date.

The number of cases listed in a given surveillance week may change as more information becomes available

Case-Follow-up and iPHIS Data Entry:

While Public Health Ontario only requires case information as provided by the laboratory report, the health unit investigates outbreak cases, as information is available, in order to provide a more accurate local picture of adverse outcomes and subtyping.

Case Reporting:

Sporadic cases do not accurately describe all cases of influenza as those cases reported are skewed towards individuals more likely to seek medical care and be tested (e.g. young, elderly and immunocompromised).

Week 17 Provincial Summary*: For the 2021-2022 surveillance season to week 17, 619 laboratory-confirmed influenza cases have been reported across Ontario, 112 (18%) of which were reported in week 17. Among cumulative cases, 99% (610/619) have been influenza A.
